### **IF YOU FIND A DEAD WILD BOAR**

#### **WHAT TO DO**

 **REPORT** THE PRESENCE AND THE EXACT LOCATION WHERE THE CARCASS WAS FOUND BY CONTACTING THE RELEVANT PROVINCIAL AUTHORITIES (SCAN THE QR CODE FOR CONTACT NUMBERS).



 **DISINFECT** THE FOOTWEAR AND CLOTHING YOU WERE WEARING AT THE TIME OF THE DISCOVERY THE ENTIRE AREA MAY BE CONTAMINATED.

#### **WHAT NOT TO DO**

 **DO NOT TOUCH** THE REMAINS - THE VIRUS IS TRANSMITTED THROUGH SIMPLE CONTACT

 **DO NOT LEAVE FOOD WASTE** (ESPECIALLY PORK PRODUCTS) OR ANY KIND OF LITTER

 **DO NOT APPROACH WILD BOARS**, NOR FEED THEM - WILD BOARS ARE UNPREDICTABLE AND POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS ANIMALS

**YOUR COOPERATION IS ESSENTIAL TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE HIGHLY INFECTIOUS ASF VIRUS. CURRENTLY, THERE ARE NO VACCINES OR TREATMENTS FOR INFECTED ANIMALS.**
